


Salve students have developed the necessary tools and opportunities for their futures – the Compass Summit is the time to celebrate all that has been accomplished. From experiences





I think being younger gives me an advantage, as completing pharmacy school in six years is pretty unique, and the structure and pace of 3+3 program has shown me that I can complete any challenge I set my mind to. The skills I have learned at Salve have helped me to excel and be comfortable in new environments like this."

Applying to Salve

Salve is a member of the Common Application and we use a holistic approach in the review process. SAT/ACT tests are optional but the following items are required to complete an application:

- Common Application and fee (\$50)
- Official high school transcript
- Two letters of recommendation

Additionally, for select applicants

- Audition required for dance, music and theatre in acting and musical theatre concentrations (see salve.edu/artsscholar)
- Portfolio required for studio art and technical theatre concentration
- Evidence of English proficiency for non-native speakers (TOEFL, IELTS or Duolingo tests)
- Curriculum information and/or portfolio of work required for homeschooled candidates
- Official college transcript and college report required for transfer students (learn more at salve.edu/transfer)
